Maths (as well as daily Numbots or TT Rockstars)

• Collect objects from your house or in the garden (e.g. lego bricks, pencils, sticks, leaves, stones) and group them into 10s. Practise counting in 10s.



- Practise counting forwards and backwards in 10s up to 50.
- What is the same about all the numbers we say when we are counting in tens?
- Practise writing the numerals correctly when counting in 10s.
- In a shop, grapes come in bunches of 10. Max wants to buy 40 grapes. How many bunches does he need?
- How do I know that the groups are equal? What does equal mean? Can you draw a picture of 5 flower pots with an equal amount of flowers in each pot? How many flowers have you got altogether? Challenge: can you do this another way?



<u>Topic</u>

Our new topic this half term is '**Under the Sea**'.

- Create a riddle about either the sea creature you researched last week or a new one. See below for an example. Challenge: can you make your riddle rhyme?
- Can you find out 5 different facts about mammals?
- Can you find a mammal that lives in the sea? Draw a picture of this animal.
- Create a list of the things that you might see or find at the beach.
- Imagine you are in a submarine in the sea. You are looking out of the porthole. Draw a picture of what you think you might see.

Riddle Examples:

I am many colours or only one. I was a home but now I am not. You might hear the sea in me. Oh, but what can I be? A Shell

I am in the sky and in the sea. I do not have gills but I live underwater. I am a common shape. I have 5 arms. What am I? *A Starfish*
