

## Maths (as well as daily Numbots or TT Rockstars)

Don't forget to play Numbots <u>https://play.numbots.com/</u> regularly as this is great for developing place value understanding. Use your TTR login to play.

We will be continuing with focusing on multiplication. Remember, multiplication can be seen as repeated addition. This week we will be looking at doubling and making equal groups. Remember, doubling is two groups of a number or an amount.

Look at the ladybirds. Can you add the same number of dots to the other side? How many dots are on each side? How many are there all together. Try adding your numbers to the following sentence: Double \_\_\_\_\_ is \_\_\_\_. Challenge: Can you create your own?




Extra Challenge activity:

Practise learning this song. It will help you remember doubling numbers within 10.

- Double 1 is 2 tap it on your shoe Double 2 is 4 stamp it on the floor Double 3 is 6 do some finger clicks Double 4 is 8 put your arms up straight Double 5 is 10 let's do it all again
- Can you match the double to the addition. Challenge: What is the total of each of the doubles?

Match the doubles to the additions.



• Can you make equal groups with the mittens? Challenge: Is there another way? How many equal groups of 2 can you make with the mittens?

- Take 20 cubes or any object you have at home. Complete the sentences.
