٠	Practise reading and spelling the Year 1, Year 2 and Year 3/4 common exception words
٠	Practise dictionary skills – look up given words and find out the definition – note what word class the word
	is (noun, verb, adjective etc)
•	Write an alphabet of favourite foods, animals, sports etc
•	Write a story in the first person (pretending you are the main character). Remember to use paragraphs
	and make your writing interesting by using adjectives and adverbs
•	Finish reading your reading book and write an alternative ending for the story.
•	Copy out 3 paragraphs from your reading books in your best handwriting and then highlight the verbs in
	one colour and the nouns in a different colour
٠	Read a David Walliams text (NOT Gangsta Granny)
Maths	s Activities – Try to do at least one of these activities each day:
•	Practise and learn by heart 2, 3, 4, 5, 8 and 10 times tables – in order and random order
٠	Practise the division facts linked to the tables listed above
•	Practise doubling and halving
•	Make a set of Roman numeral cards 1 – 12 and a set of Arabic numbers 1 – 12 (normal digits) – play snap
	and pairs with the cards
٠	Practise weighing – maybe do some cooking!
Topic	Activities – Try to do at least one of these activities each day:
٠	Find out about Julius Caesar. Complete a mini project about him. Who was he and what did he do? This
	could be written and could include lots of pictures / drawings
•	Find out – How did the romans keep clean? Research and explain using paragraphs and pictures
