Year 4 Home Learning Summer Term 1 Week 1


Hello Year 4

<u>English</u>

Our new text is Gregory Cool by Caroline Binch.

Activity 1: We have included a separate document of the complete story (with kind permission from the publisher) **but** before you read it please look at the photo of Gregory and his grandparents below, talk about the picture and answer these questions

with a grown up or other member of your family. You can record your answers in your purple book.

Who are these people? What is their relationship to each other? What are they doing? What are they thinking? How are they feeling and why?

Then look at the picture of the front cover and compare it to the first. What's different and why?

Activity 2: Now, read the story from the PDF and look up any words you don't understand. Use a dictionary to help or talk to an adult.

Activity 3: Use the questions below to talk about the text with someone at home then write them in your book.

- 1. Why has Gregory come to Tobago? How does he feel about it?
- 2. How does he feel about his grandparents' house? Why does Grandpa find this funny?
- 3. What does Gregory feel is wrong with his room?
- 4. Why does Gregory look away quickly after looking at Lennox's feet?
- 5. In paragraph 9 why does Lennox get so cross with Gregory and how do you think Gregory feels about upsetting him?
- 6. What does Gregory think when he gets to the beach?
- 7. Gregory seems to feel better after talking to the fishermen, why do you think that is?
- 8. Why can't Gregory climb the tree as easily as Lennox and how does he feel about this?
- 9. Why does Gregory want to be barefoot too?
- 10. By the end of the story Gregory has completely changed his mind about Tobago, why?

Activity 4: Make a table to compare the character, appearance and lives of Lennox and Gregory.

Activity 5: Use the information from Activity 4 to imagine yourself as either Lennox or Gregory and ask a family member to interview you (hot seating). You could come up with the questions or get a family member or adult to read the story and come up with their own.



Maths - Money

Activity 1: Can you write the following amounts using a \pounds sign and a decimal point? See if you can also put these in order from lowest amount to highest.

343p

370p

57p

1256p

185p

Activity 2: Class A saves 3,589 pennies. Class B saves 3,859 pennies. Write these amounts again using a £ sign. Which class saves the most? Explain how you know?

Activity 3: Ron has £48. He spends one quarter of his money. How much does he have left? You might use a bar model to help.



Activity 4: Bowling costs £6 for adults and £3.20 for children. Can you find out how much a family of 2 adults and 2 children would pay? Can you work out how much change they would have from £20?

Activity 5: Set up your own virtual shop at home. Find things to sell at home, add some price labels and then ask your family to buy some things. You will need to ask how they are paying (cash only!) and then work out their change. If an adult takes a photo of your shop you might even be able to send a message to family members -so they can join in and shop online with you? Happy shopping!

<u>Topic</u>

Geography

Activity 1: Gregory visits Tobago. Can you find out where it is and draw a map of the island and its flag? Please label the main towns and cities and physical features (e.g. mountains, rivers, forests etc.)

Activity 2: Research Tobago on the internet and take notes about your favourite 6-10 facts. Remember to use sub-headings to organise your research. Try these websites:
