<u> Topic - Mini-beasts</u>

SMSC. Science.

• Listen to Mrs Porter read The Very Lazy Ladybird. Talk about the characters that are in the story. How do you think they were feeling? What would you do if you were one of the characters in the story and how would you feel?

• Research into ladybirds, talk about what you already know about them. What size, shape and colour are they? Where do they live, what is their habitat? What do they eat?

• Create your own ladybird story and draw pictures in it too. If you want to why not film yourself or someone in your family reading it?

• Go on a mini-beast hunt. Keep a tally chart, take photos or draw them. Did you spot a ladybird?

• Make a collage picture of a ladybird using different materials such as paper, food packaging, wrapping paper, material, crayons, card and tissue paper. Any old scrap

will do but make sure you use the correct shapes and colours so it does look like a ladybird!
