English

RE

Our RE question this half term is – Why do some people think life is a journey and what experiences mark this? We will be looking at diefferent faiths and religions as part our thinking and learning.

History

In class, we shall continue to focus on one times table at a time over several weeks to ensure a deep understanding and quick recall. We also teach the commutative law and the inverse relationship for each multiplication fact. We have now covered all of the times tables and will recap some of the ones we are not so confident with.

Science

This half term, we will be learning about animals. We'll begin by exploring the different habitats animals live in, then move on to recap the
