To ensure the Friends can be sustained into the future, we do need more people to volunteer to support events. At the AGM, we discussed how we could facilitate people being able to volunteer without having to make a significant time commitment. GOVERNOR UPDATE

As you are aware a recruitment process is under way to find a new headteacher for St John's. I am pleased to let you know that we have received a number of applications for the permanent headteacher role and we shall be interviewing candidates next week. Part of the interview process will take place in school with candidates undertaking a variety of tasks on Thursday next week. Candidates may visit classes and speak with children and staff as part of this process. Mrs Marsland will speak to children about the process so they know who the visitors are and why they are in school.

Once the recruitment process is complete we will send out a further update, but please be aware that we won't be in a position to make any announcements until all recruitment activities and suitability checks are complete. We anticipate being in a position to make an announcement towards the end of this month.

We are also recruiting an interim headteacher to lead and look after St John's in between Mrs Marsland's departure and the start of the new permanent headteacher. We will update you towards the end of this month on this process.

LOTS TO LOOK FORWARD TO!

The next half term is also super busy, with lots of things for us to look forward to and enjoy in the lead up to Christmas:

REMEMBRANCE PARADE

On Sunday 13th November, children are welcome to join in with the Frome Remembrance Parade. If you would like to join us, Mr Leak will be at the Cadet Hall on Keyford from 10.30am for any children who wish to parade down, or Mrs Marsland will be at the Memorial from 10.30am. Parents remain responsible for their own children at all times.

ODD SOCKS DAY AND ANTI-BULLYING WEEK

Next week, is National Anti-Bullying Week. Our definition of bullying is taken from the Anti-Bullying Alliance:

'Bullying is the **repetitive, intentional hurting** of one person or group by another person or group, where the relationship involves an **imbalance of power**. It can happen face to face or online.' (Anti-Bullying Alliance)

I have already talked to the children in Collective Worship about what bullying is, the impact of bullying, and how we can work together to stop bullying. This year's theme for Anti-Bullying Week is 'Reach Out'. Children are being encouraged to reach out to a trusted adult if they are being bullied, or if they know that someone else is being bullied and to reach out with kindness to children who are being bullied. We will continue to explore all of these themes on into next week and beyond.

Anti-Bullying Week kicks off with Odd Socks Day on Monday. We would like to encourage children to wear odd socks on Monday and all week if they would like to. Wearing odd socks symbolises a celebration of us all being unique.



I am in the process of updating our Anti-Bullying Policy, which I aim to share with you next week. The Senior Leadership Team have also made some small adjustments to our Behaviour and Relationships for Learning Policy, which can be found on the School Website under Key Information – Key Documents.

HOME / SCHOOL AGREEMENT

Now, that all children have been in school for half a term, and are very clear about our core values and school rules, we are sending home our Home / School Agreement, attached to this email. We ask that you take time reading this and also talking to your child about their section, which quite simply requires them to uphold the school values and the follow our 'Five Be Rules.' We then ask that you and your child sign the agreement electronically through ParentMail.

Our Year 2 children will be attending an Archery Festival and our Year 3 children will be attending an Ultimate Frisbee Festival later this term. I am extremely grateful to Mr Bowman, who always ensures our St John's children benefit from any sporting opportunities taking place in the Frome Learning Partnership.
