So, we are at the end of our first complete week in school, and I am so proud of how everyone has settled back into school routines, with children and staff all working very hard — thank you and well done! I am SUPER proud of Ash Class and Oak Class who have been awesome! They have been in all day every day, had lunch in the hall and joined us this afternoon for our first Zoom Headteacher Awards. They have been coming into school independently, mostly with big smiles on their faces, and I don't think I have seen two reception classes sit so nicely at the start of each day. Well done to them!

Thank you to those of you who managed to join us for our Year Group Curriculum Sessions, held this week after school. For those of you who were unable to attend, the Powerpoint presentations should now be on Seesaw for you to refer to, and you can send any questions via Seesaw or indeed the year group email address. Just for your information, we did sound our emergency alarms for approximately 10 seconds this afternoon, so that all new children have experienced the sound and to remind everyone else. We will be carrying out a practise evacuation at some point next week. On this occasion, children will be told just ahead of it happening.

We have had quite a few enquiries about after school clubs. I would love to be in the position to say these can start immediately, but as I said we are approaching things with caution. Our caution with reinstating these clubs, is not about mixing of children at this time, our caution is around the capacity to offer them and sustain them, and not having to cancel at short notice due to staffing. We have already been stretched at times with staffing during the school day, where staff have themselves been poorly or have poorly children who need looking after. I do not want to disappoint children or disrupt parent arrangements by cancelling clubs. Also, for any providers who are not school based staff, we do need to make new arrangements and do new DBS checks before they can start. Over the next couple of weeks, I will talk to children about what after school clubs they would really like to have, and we will aim to have clubs up and running for straight after October half term. Mr Croucher's clubs will be able to start sooner, so do look out for communication about this. Choir will also definitely be back up and running after half term, initially for just Years 3 and 4.

Finally... from me... I have had a lovely week, made so much better by being back in the hall with the children singing! Years 3 and 4 had singing with me on Tuesday, and Years 1 and 2 joined me on Thursday. We sang lots of harvest songs, and it was just great!

Please make sure your child has a coat in school.

If your child is asthmatic, they must have a prescribed inhaler in school at all times. Please ensure it is in date and named, and that you have signed it in to school on a medical form.
