Staffing Update

We are delighted to welcome Mrs Moss back in school in Ash Class. To aid her return she is currently working one day a week – Fridays, and Mrs Budd is continuing to cover Thursdays for us. As already shared with Year 3 parents, I will continue to teach Willow Class, with some cover from Mrs Willis when she is available. While Mr Bowman has Bath Spa teacher Miss Birkett on her final placement, he has some capacity to work also with Willow Class, which will provide them with extra special transition opportunities with their next teacher.

In the last few months, in line with best practice, the Governors have reviewed our Senior Leadership Structure for next academic year. A review such as this has not been carried out at St John's since September 2017. The new Senior Leadership Team from September 2022 will be Headteacher, Deputy Headteacher, Assistant Headteacher, SENCO and Business Manager. The role of Assistant Headteacher is a new role; I am delighted to announce that Mr Bowman was succesful with his application, and governors have appointed him to the role. The Governors would like to express their sincere thanks to Mrs Simenton, Mrs Llewellyn and Mrs Scruby, who have been highly valued members of the Senior Leadership Team were integral to the successful management and leadership of the school, especially from September 2017 – January 2021 when the school did not have a Deputy Headteacher.

In addition to our Bath Spa teacher, Miss Birkett, who joined us in Sycamore last term, we will be welcoming SCITT teacher Ms McBryde to Poplar class for her final teaching placement from this week.

Sadly I have some departures to let you know about. Ms Priddle, our Special Needs Co-ordinator (SENCO) will be retiring at the end of this academic year after 13 years at St John's, and Mrs Rylatt has also let us know that she has decided not to return to work following her recent maternity leave. Miss Broderick, who currently works within the Reception team will also be leaving at the end of the summer term. We wish them all the very best with their future plans.

We will be advertising the SENCO post shortly, and will update you as recruitment for this vital post progresses.

Staffing structure and classes in September

I had hoped to be able to share with you our plans for which classes were going where, and who would be teaching them. We are nearly there with the structure, but not quite, and it would not be helpful for me to send a structure out this week and possibly need to change it next week. We will endeavour to share the structure with you before the half term holiday, but most certainly during the first week back at the latest.

As explained to Reception parents when their children started - although the children have been separated for registration and daily phonics lessons, they have very much been mixing together as one whole group for the vast majority of the time. This was to help us to try and ensure that we knew the children really well, and they had the opportunity to establish friendships across the year group. Reception teachers are already working on grouping the children into two Year 1 classes, which we hope will be balanced in terms of gender and ability. We will inform parents of the class groupings as soon as they are finalised.

We have decided not to mix the classes in any other year group this year as we feel that children have had enough significant disruption to their school life over the last two years. We feel that any benefits gained from correcting any slight imbalances in gender / ability etc would be outweighed by the transition of settling into a new class grouping.

Outdoor Learning Leading to Forest School

I am really excited to inform you that we will be developing a new Outdoor Learning provision from September. In time, we hope to offer Forest School across the school. We are in the process of planning this provision and will give you further details before September.

Jubilee May Fair
