- Have high expectations of themselves and their children ensuring each child achieves his or her full potential
- Prepare lessons carefully to meet the needs and abilities of all children
- Provide a balanced and engaging curriculum to meet individual needs
- > Ensure the classroom and other areas of the school provide a safe and attractive learning environment
- Model and promote good behaviour and relationships
- > Teach and model social and emotional aspects of learning
- Investigate incidents carefully and promptly listening to both sides
- Apply rewards and sanctions consistently and fairly
- Involve children in deciding the school rules
- Inform parents what is being is being taught each term
- > Work with families and other agencies to ensure children's needs are met
- Meet with parents in the autumn and spring terms to discuss your child's progress, and produce a report in the summer
- Work with other Frome schools to ensure smooth transition

 - Be respectful
 - Be kind and gentle

- Attend school and arrive in good time
- Report bullying or any accident or incident
- Look after the school equipment

PARENTS / CARERS WILL:

- > Uphold the school's core values of Wisdom, Respect, Hope, Self-Control, Friendship and Perseverance
- Respect and support the staff in promoting the school's rules with their children
- > Model good behaviour to their children particularly around school site
- > Ensure their child attends school and arrives in good time, with the correct clothing and equipment
- > Inform school when their child is ill on the first day of absence
- > Ensure that on school days children have had a good night's sleep and preferably a good breakfast
- > Support their child's 'home learning' as indicated in the Homework Policy
- Notify the school of their child's needs, including any changes to their child's circumstances, which may affect their ability to manage in school
- Attend teacher/parent meetings
- > Ensure that the school always has up to date telephone numbers in case of emergency
- Raise any concerns they have with their child's education directly with school staff and not on social media
