Dear Parents and Carers,

In April 2021, the Board of Governors conducted an online survey with parents and carers to get feedback on their views of St John's First School, Frome. The results have been analysed and the Governing Board will communicate in the new school year in September how they intend to prioritise and incorporate some of the feedback in 2021-2022. It has been an incredibly challenging period for everyone with the COVID pandemic for pupils, parents, and teachers a like. We want to ensure we are listening to all your voices so we can continue to improve the school so that *together we give our children the roots to grow, and the wings to fly*.

The survey was based on OFSTED parent questions, with Governors adapting it to include additional questions, particularly around in response to COVID. The parent survey will be conducted on an annual basis.

We had a fantastic response to the survey with 189 responses. We cannot thank you all enough for taking the time to provide feedback. Below is a brief overview of the questions and results as well as some specific feedback. We take these responses seriously and will discuss them as a staff and governor team so that we do address these concerns and improve our provision.
