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Dear Parents and Carers,

In the 2022 summer term we asked you to provide feedback in the form of an online survey to let us know what is working at St John's school and what areas need improvement for the academic year 2021/22. Building on the survey conducted in 2020/2021, this is the second year we have asked parents and carers for their feedback. Although there is less focus on the COIVD response this year, the survey does include the 14 questions from the official Ofsted Parent View survey as well as other questions from the 2020/2021 survey. We will communicate throughout this academic year how we intend to incorporate your feedback, so that *together we give our children the roots to grow, and the wings to fly*.

Areas for improvement from the 2020/21 survey included providing clearer feedback on how children are doing and having high expectations of children in St John's. While there is still much to do, we believe we have addressed some of this feedback by hosting in person 'Stay and Learn' sessions at school for reception children, and 'Share My Work' sessions for Years 1 to 4, as well as hosting virtual parents' evenings. The new curriculum, for foundation subjects, was rolled out in 2021. It uses themes or topics to frame the learning and has allowed the children to immerse themselves in an area of study over an extended period. In the core subject areas, we have targeted our attention on increasing the level of challenge and raising children's expectations of themselves.

Thank you so much to everyone who took the time to provide their feedback and thoughts and we are looking forward to building stronger relationships between parents, carers and governors in the coming academic year 2022/23. Although down on last year, we still had a good response with 131 parents and carers (50%) providing feedback on their children.

We are delighted to see that 92% of respondents would recommend St John's CE VA First School, Frome to other parents and that 98% of respondents think their child felt safe and happy at the school.

Q1: My child feels happy at this school







#### Areas for improvement

The following questions received the highest overall response when 'strongly disagree' and 'disagree' were combined.



Q10. The school lets me know how my child is doing.

Q14. The school gives clear feedback on how my child is doing. Q8. The school has high expectations for my child.

Comparatively, the top three response in 2020/21 were:

- The school gives clear feedback on how my child is doing (8%)
- The school has high expectations of my child (7%)
- The school is a welcoming and inclusive community that fosters and encourages family-wide participation in all aspects of school life (6%)

More needs to be done this year to provide clearer communication and feedback to parents, carers and children. The overarching written feedback was for improved, clear and timely communications from the school. Currently, there is too much information, that is not centralised making it difficult for parents to manage various means of communication. In response to this feedback the school is sending out weekly reminder emails with key dates for parents and carers and Seesaw is being used consistently across year 1-4 providing parent and carers with weekly updates on progress in the classroom.











#### Responses that answered 'don't know'

The following questions were the top three that received the highest responses for 'don't know'. Please note that Ofsted interprets 'Don't Know' and 'No Return' as a positive response for the school, as these responses indicate that you do not have a problem or concern with the school. However, we have decided to highlight the 'don't know' responses.



Q8. The school has high expectations for my child.

Q13. The school supports my child's wider personal development.

Comparing the results from last academic year (2020/21) – the responses then were:

- The school has high expectations of my child (21%)
- My child can take part in clubs and activities at this school (18%) this response featured in the top responses in this year's survey.
